1. Apply for the Grant by October 12th, 2017
2. Review of Application by Grant Review Committee by October 24th, 2017
3. Grant Award Letter issued to Grant Recipients by October 30st, 2017
4. Grant Award Walkthrough by November 6th, 2017
5. Execution of Grant Award Agreement by November 15th, 2017
6. Project Kick-Off by November 21st, 2017
